



What do I need for a library card at the Mishawaka-Penn-Harris Public Library?

You will need one form of ID AND one proof of Indiana residency to apply for a library card.

Forms of identification (MUST have a birthdate listed):

- Valid Indiana Driver's License or State ID card
- Passport or Green Card
- Workplace Identification Card
- Student Picture ID
- Military Picture ID

Current* printed forms providing proof of residency:

- Checks
- Paycheck Stub
- Property Tax Receipt
- Lease or Rent Receipt
- Valid Car Registration
- Bank Statement, Credit Card Bill, Utility Bill

*Not older than 30 days from the time of library card registration

Lending Limits:

- Movies: 10 per card
- Magazines & CDs: 15 per card
- Playaway View & Playaway Audio: 2 per card

Loan Periods:

- 21 days with the exception of the following
- Fiction Movies: 4 days
- Playaway View: 7 days
- Adult & Young Adult Magazines: 14 days

Fees and Fines:

- Movie Rentals: Free up to 4 days
- Overdue Printed Materials: .25¢ per day
- Overdue CDs and Audiobooks: .25¢ per day
- Overdue Movies and Playaway View: \$1 per day

Renewals:

Materials checked out can often be renewed up to three times by calling Circulation Services at any location or by going online to mphpl.org.

Holds:

Placing a hold is free and is available for most materials.
