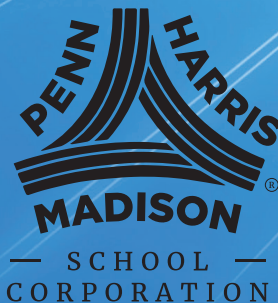

LEARN TO SWIM

Three Sessions



Session I: June 11–22

Session II: June 25–29 and July 9–13 (no classes July 2–6)

Session III: July 16–27

Penn-Harris-Madison Community Education is offering three sessions of Learn-to-Swim classes at Penn High School. Children must be at least four-years-old and toilet trained. Each two-week session includes 10 classes of 30 minutes each. The cost is \$40 per two week session per child.

Classes during each session run daily Monday thru Friday at the following times:

8:00 a.m., 8:40 a.m., 9:20 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 1:10 p.m., 1:50 p.m., 2:30 p.m.

Each child will be tested on the first day of class and will be placed in one of the Red Cross swim levels. In order to receive certification at the end of each session, children must attend testing on the first day.

Registration

Registrations are accepted online, by phone, or in person. Registrations by mail are NOT accepted.

- Online registration for Learn-to-Swim begins on Monday, April 16 at 10:00 a.m.
- Starting Monday, April 16 at 10:00 a.m., registrations are accepted in person at the Educational Services Center, 55900 Bittersweet Road, Mishawaka (north of Penn High School) from 10:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. and from 1:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.
- Also on Monday, April 16 at 10:00 a.m., you may register by phone using a Discover, Visa or MasterCard debit/credit card or eCheck by calling 574.258.9568 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. and from 1:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.

A 3.49% fee is added to all credit/debit card and eCheck registrations.

• Parents of four-year-olds will be required to show a birth certificate for the child **at the time of registration by emailing a copy of the birth certificate to jforkner@phm.k12.in.us**. A child must be four years old by the date of the session(s) he/she will attend. **No exceptions.**

• Class size is limited and slots will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

• Refunds, minus a \$10 processing fee for each child, will be made upon your cancellation with our office at least three business days prior to the start of the session. A refund check is mailed to you and may take up to 3 weeks to receive.

• A \$5 processing fee for each child, will be charged for all transfers. Transfer fees must be made with cash or check brought to the Community Education office. Transfer fees can not be made with credit/debit cards or by eCheck.
