P-H-M Community Education is offering Learn-to-Swim classes at Penn High School. Children must be at least 4 years old and toilet trained. Each two-week session (10 classes) is 30 minutes each. The cost is \$40 per two week session per child.

Classes during each session run daily Monday thru Friday at the following times:

8:00 a.m., 8:40 a.m., 9:20 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 1:10 p.m., 1:50 p.m., 2:30 p.m.

Children will be tested on the first day of class and will be placed in the Red Cross swim levels. To receive certification at the end of each session, children must attend testing on the first day.
