Phased-in Approach

- Plan approved by the St. Joseph County Department of Health
- Mondays will remain virtual for all secondary students through Spring Break
- Students who committed to virtual learning for the 2nd semester will remain virtual through at least Spring Break

Updates from the SJCDoH

Beginning on Monday, April 12th

- Secondary Building Capacity increased to 85%
- Classroom contact tracing distance reduced from 6ft to 3ft (per IDOH)
 - Examples of exceptions: School Bus, Lunch Room, and other activities deemed an elevated risk



State Testing Modification

Reminder, on Monday, May 3rd and Tuesday, May 4th all <u>P-H-M Middle</u>

<u>Schools</u> will observe an asynchronous eLearning day to allow all grades 3-8 virtual students to participate in state required ILEARN testing in-person. Details to be provided from your building principal.



Transition from Virtual Learning

We are *always* working towards a full return to school when we can be confident of its safety because we know it to be the most ideal learning environment for our students.



Waitlist for Virtual Students

- Round 1 All secondary parent requests made by 3/11/21 to return to in-person learning on 4/12/21 were honored
- Round 2 All secondary parent requests made by 3/19/21 to return to in-person learning on 4/12/21 were honored
- Round 3 Window opened on 3/22/21. Secondary parent request received by <u>4/23/21</u> to be <u>considered</u> for a possible 5/3/21 return to in-person learning
- We continue to work with the SJCDoH to monitor our metrics, determine future capacity, and determine timelines.

Changes to the Learning Environment

Recommendations from the SJCDoH and IDOH

- State and local public health experts are the most well informed and well equipped to interpret data and make informed recommendations about the safety of our students, staff, and the greater community
- Update: secondary classroom "podding"

Indiana's Back on Track Framework

Gov. Holcomb's color-coded system was designed to guide Indiana decision
 makers about the safety of schooling based on levels of community spread



Changes to the Learning Environment

Availability of Human Resources

We must have a critical mass of available teachers, support staff, substitutes,
 etc. to safely open schools

Academic Calendar and Communications Considerations

- To the greatest extent possible, changes should align with natural windows in the academic calendar to provide smooth transitions
- To the greatest extent possible, parents and teachers should have sufficient time to plan for adjustments

Protocols and Procedures

- P-H-M will continue to enforce all current protocols and procedures implemented for the 2020-21 school year
- P-H-M will enforce the mask mandate in place through the end of the school year per Executive order 21-09

Color-coded counties:Information for schools, local officials

Goal:

To provide a system that local and school officials can use to understand the level of community spread and how it is changing on the county level, so they can make decisions. Schools have asked for guidance based on the metrics.


 Scoring does not trigger a state requirement of any action, but provides local information and recommendations



Color-coded counties: Information for schools, local officials

The metrics:

- Blue: 0 .9
- **■** Yellow: 1 1.9
- Orange: 2 2.5
- Red: Greater than 2.5



Results as of 4/12/21 at 11:59pm

IDOH Color-coded counties: Information for schools & local officials

- Blue minimal community spread, indicating that schools can operate all grades in person, but limit activities where social distancing is not feasible.
- Yellow moderate community spread, indicating schools can operate all grades in person, but increase vigilance in social distancing, hand hygiene and masks.
- Orange moderate to high community spread, indicating grade schools can operate in person, but local officials strongly recommend hybrid learning for middle and high school students.
- Red high community spread, indicating grade schools can operate in person, but local officials strongly recommend hybrid learning for middle and high school students.

Safety Protocols Implemented for In-Person Learning:

- Teacher and Staff Vaccinations
- Social distancing
- Wearing masks while indoors
 - Provided two cloth masks per student & staff member
- Face shields for staff
- Gloves for staff
- Hand sanitizer
- Plexiglass barriers

 - Offices
 - Teacher desks
 - Individual barriers for student desks
- Additional custodial staffing & hours
 - o increased cleaning & disinfectant protocols
- Purchase & use of Electrostatic Sprayers

- Daily self-screening checks
- Hand washing stations
- Water bottle dispensing stations
- Infrared thermometers in the health office
- Disinfectant cleaner & paper towels for each classroom
- High efficiency air filters (MERV-13)
- Communications with staff & parents of positive cases in buildings
- Launched P-H-M COVID-19 Positive


