Our Why

At PHM, we believe every child has unique strengths and potential.

Our High Ability Program is designed to recognize and nurture those talents, ensuring that all students are challenged, engaged, and supported in their academic journey.



What is High Ability?

Some students show advanced strengths in reading, math, or problem-solving. PHM identifies these students as high ability and provides the right level of challenge to help them grow.

We call it enrichment, not acceleration—because the goal isn't just to go faster, but to go deeper. We want these students to explore big ideas, make connections, and engage with their learning.



Identification

- In Indiana, students can be identified as high ability based on achievement or aptitude. At PHM, we use nationally normed tests to assess math and ELA:
 - CogAT: Assesses reasoning and aptitude
 - NWEA: Measures academic achievement
- > Formal identification years include:
 - Kindergarten, second grade, and fifth grade
- > Informal identification years include:
 - First, third, and fourth grades
 - Assessment is based on teacher nominations & watchlists during these years.



How We Serve High Ability Students

Elementary Grades K-5

• Cluster Grouping:

High ability students are grouped together in one classroom per grade,
 allowing for differentiated instruction tailored to their needs.

• Language Arts:

- Differentiated reading and writing instruction.
- Use of off-grade level materials and resources
 - Junior Great Books, Scholastic Scope, & Scholastic Storyworks

• Mathematics:

- Mastery of on-grade level skills
- Introduction to off-grade level standards to challenge and extend learning
- Additional resources: Beast Academy
